Audlem's a winner

Thank you to everyone who contributed towards Audlem's entry in the 2011 Community Pride Competition organised by Cheshire Community Action. Once again Audlem was well represented at October's prize-giving ceremony where Parish Council Chairman, Kate Down, accepted the Community Spirit award.

The village has not competed for this award since 2005 when it won the Cheshire and North of England awards, as well as the national award from Defra (Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs).

This year, the village also won the Little Gem award for the Audlem signs located at Little Heath, Tollgate Drive, and the junction of Woore Road and Paddock Lane. Congratulations to all concerned.

Sale of the school building has been agreed and is awaiting completion. By the end of this year Buerton PC should have funding to commence building a play area on the field. The scrub area on the field will be cleared and the mature trees pruned as necessary.

Church roof appeal

Parishioners may recall that lead was stolen from the north aisle of St James's church roof earlier this year. This section of the roof is visible to a very few residents and therefore vulnerable. To prevent any recurrence following repair, we have permission to replace this section of the roof with an alternative material.

The repair will cost £20,000 and even with insurance money and the proceeds from selling the remaining lead on that section, we still have a shortfall of £8,000.

The upkeep of this historic building is funded only by our local community, with help from grants for a few small projects. We know that many residents have been delighted with the work we have had done on the steps, and we want to keep our church waterproof and in good condition for the future.

The Parliamentary Boundary Review Committee has published its initial proposals. These include reducing the number of constituencies in England from 533 to 502. Each constituency will contain a similar number of electors as now.

Audlem is currently part of the Eddisbury Constituency. The review plans to increase the size of the constituency from 65,000 to just over 74,000, mainly by the transfer of villages surrounding Chester. It also proposes changing its name from Eddisbury to Winsford. This is the largest town in Eddisbury but geographically overall it has a very rural character. Audlem Lass sails to success

The volunteer crew of Audlem Lass is celebrating the success of their weekend water taxi's first season.

Since the free service started running between the Overwater Marina and Audlem's Lock 15 in April, the volunteer crew has notched up over 832 hours and made more than 1,300 individual trips transporting over 4,000 people and 78 dogs. Passengers have donated over £3,800 and, after deducting running costs, the money will go to the Royal National Lifeboat Institution and to a new lifeboat at New Brighton on the Wirral, Merseyside, next to one of Britain's busiest shipping lanes.

The service is now closed until spring when details of the new programme will be announced. Thank you to all the volunteers and everyone who has supported Audlem Lass throughout her first sailing season.
