A Summary of Parish Council business – January 2008

## EMERGENCY AMBULANCE SERVICES TO AUDLEM

For some time now the Parish Council has been urging the Ambulance Service to improve emergency services to Audlem and district, with Ambulance personnel attending 3 meetings in the village over the last 8 months. Early in January, Councillors were delighted to learn that, from 12th January at the latest, an additional rapid response vehicle will be operating from Crewe, and that a second vehicle will join the fleet in the very near future. The high dependency ambulance fleet is also being increased in Congleton and Wilmslow, which will have a positive knock-on effect for our services. These additional vehicles, together with changes to the way in which the fleet is deployed, should result in a better response times for Audlem. The Parish Council has also learned that that a manager for the new First Responder service was now in post and would be liaising with staff at Audlem Fire Station to get the operation off the ground. The Parish Council will continue to be active on behalf of residents to ensure that these improvements feed through to us as promised.

## AUDLEM YOUTH COUNCIL

Young people of the parish now have a say in local matters, and will hopefully learn how to go about making the changes they want. The Youth Council has had three meetings at St James' School (on 5th November, 3rd December and 7th January at 6.30 pm). So far, discussions have included the condition and lighting of some local footpaths, re-location of the teen shelter and frequency of visits by the Youth Service Canybus to Audlem. Councillors Richard Furber, Kate Down, Geoff Stretch and Mike Hill are leading this initiative.

#### **BUDGETS FOR 2008/09**

At the Parish Council meeting on 7th January, the precept for 2008/09 was set at £27,683.

## CO-OP PARKING - THE ENFORCEMENT ISSUE

Following the discussion at January's Parish Council meeting on the vexed issue of delivery vans servicing the new Co-op, Geoff Smethurst has received the following response from



Rachel Bolton, Planning Compliance Officer at Crewe and Nantwich Borough Council:

"Dear Mr Smethurst

cc Ken Maple, Cheshire Police

Thank you for your email regarding the deliveries to the new Co-op in Audlem. My colleague, Ros Ellison has forwarded your email to me.

Condition 13 on the notice of permission for P06/1125 requires the parking and turning facility for the apartments and the retail units to be surfaced and marked out before occupation.

I visited the site yesterday and can confirm that the turning area has not yet been provided in accordance with the permission. I will write to Muller Properties requesting that the surfacing is undertaken as a matter of urgency, this should then allow the Co-op deliveries to take place to the rear of the front block and off Shropshire Street. From a planning perspective it should be noted that although the turning facility is to be provided the local planning authority can not make the coop delivery lorry use the turning area. I can confirm that there are no conditions requiring deliveries to take place within the site. However, when I have received a response from Muller Properties, I will write to the area manager of the Co-op encouraging them to use this turning facility when it has been provided.

The police are best placed to advise you with regards to the parking and traffic problems.

I trust this is satisfactory for the time being. If I can be of further assistance please do not hesitate to contact me."

Let's hope that these actions, combined with the letters the Parish Council agreed to send to Cheshire County Council (Highways), the Borough Council, Mullers and the Co-op about delivery van parking and off-loading obstructions, bring matters to a satisfactory conclusion.

## LICENCE FILLIP FOR PUBLIC HALL

After two years of operating within the restrictive regime of using Temporary Events Notices (TENs), the Public Hall is now fully licensed to allow the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises. In order to obtain the licence Geoff Stretch, Chairman of the Hall's management committee, has had to attend and pass a training course to become the Designated Premises Supervisor.

Obtaining the licence overcomes the major problem that restricted the Public Hall to just having a maximum of twelve TENs each year, when alcohol could be sold at either private or public functions. The limit has now been increased to a maximum of one hundred, way above the number of functions that would be held in any one year.

There are still conditions that have to be met and each request for hire where the provision of alcohol is involved will still have to be approved by Cheshire Police.

In the Hall itself, as part of the ongoing improvements, the bar has been redesigned and is being re-equipped, both to improve its appearance and make it easier to use for customers and bar staff.

It is hoped that the Hall will now be used for more functions, both private and public. Anyone interested in booking the Public Hall can ring 01270 811684.

## From Audlem Online:

## **BIG VOTE ON PLASTIC BAG ISSUE**

The number of votes cast in the current Audlem.org Vote Poll asking "Should Audlem join the list of communities that are banning the use of plastic bags?" has passed the 500 mark. This is the largest number of votes ever cast in an Audlem Online poll.

The number of 'Yes' votes is 368, 'No' votes are 129 while 5 people are unsure. With this strength of opinion, it's good to know that this issue will be raised at the next Audlem Village Traders' Association meeting for the village's retailers to discuss the issue and plan how to respond.

Following the massive Vote Poll on plastic bags - showing a large majority in favour of banning their use - we now have a new poll on an issue that might attract an equally large vote.

Given the lively debate on the traffic issues since the new Co-op opened, both on the Audlem Online Forum and at this week's Parish Council meeting, we ask "Do you want to see more double yellow line parking restrictions in Audlem village centre?"

One resident said at the Parish Council meeting he feared that more parking restrictions would destroy the character of Audlem. Others may think it's the only way to avoid the regular traffic jams, particularly when there are deliveries to the Co-op. Given the complexity of the issue - see the recent news stories on "Co-op parking - the enforcement issue" - we are also be running a Forum on the subject
