<u>A Summary of Parish Council business – July 2007</u> ANNUAL VILLAGE MEETING – 24th MAY

The second Annual Village Meeting was well attended and thanks are due to the speakers who gave up their time to talk to us. About 70 residents heard Lucy Johnson describe the work of her organisation "Visit Chester & Cheshire" which represents the Tourism Board for Cheshire and Warrington. Efforts are now being directed towards promoting this area as one of the gateways to the Capital of Culture 2008, which will also be "Cheshire Year of the Gardens". Dr Russell Muirhead explained recent changes in the Audlem Medical Practice and answered a range of questions from the audience. Bob Cartwright updated us on the many and various aspects of the Parish Plan, and Andrew Smith spoke on behalf of Audlem Traders' Association and fielded questions about the future of Audlem Post Office.

<u>Churchfields:</u> The Parish Council has instituted changes in management of the nature reserve and will be trying to strike a balance between the two extremes of total wilderness and suburban lawn. The areas at the centre and at the perimeter will be left uncut for a longer period each year so that the flora and fauna can flourish. A circular path will be cut so that school and playgroup will have easy access. The situation will be monitored to see if any further changes or improvements can be made as time goes on.

ANNUAL REPORT 2006/07

Richard Furber, Parish Council Chairman says:

Firstly I would like to thank the Parish Councillors and the clerk, Jean White, for the support they have given me in the past twelve months. It makes the Chairman's role so much easier with such enthusiastic support.

Following the retirement of Paul Huntbach, Peter Morgan was co-opted onto Audlem Parish Council. A silver salver was presented to Paul in recognition of his loval service.

Community Pride Competition: On 28th September Parish Council representatives went along to the prize giving at Tatton Park, and were delighted to be presented with the "Best Kept Village" award. We have entered this competition again in two categories: "Best Kept Village" and "Best Village Newsletter". Particular thanks to Margaret Roberts and the team for producing such a lively and informative newsletter. We were also delighted to be 'Highly Commended' in the "Best of the Best" competition which followed on from the Calor "Village of the Year" competition.

Shops: We welcome the opening of the Animal Food Store in the centre of the village, and the re-opening of the Mill Shop on the canal wharf. Best wishes to all new proprietors in their ventures - please support and use all local businesses. We are hoping that the Post Office is spared from closure.

Parish Plan: As many of you are aware, the Parish Council is negotiating to acquire land in Audlem Vale, one of the most popular walks in the area. The District Valuer has been involved and an offer has been made for the land. We await events. Efforts continue to secure funding for a Sport Hall and Leisure Centre. The website, audlem.org, continues to be a mine of information, with the vote poll creating a lot of interesting results.

The Parish Council requested the Borough Council to update the children's playground and renew play equipment, and also to refurbish the public toilets in the car park. I am delighted to see that these requests have been addressed. We also supported our local fire fighters, helping them to retain the fire engine, rather than it being replaced with a 'tactical response vehicle' which would have been unable to reach the top of a three-storey house.

The Public Hall continues to be improved. It has been redecorated both inside and out, windows have been replaced and a new 'state of the art' kitchen installed. Thanks to Geoff, Olive and the committee. Thanks also to all local organisers and volunteers who, as usual, worked hard put on so many successful events throughout the year.

Ambulance response times: Following complaints about response times the Ambulance service attended a CAT meeting in February. Our MP, Stephen O'Brien helped to organise and attended a public meeting with Ambulance officials in Audlem Public Hall in June.

Village Policing: Please support PC Ken Maple in his efforts for the village, especially with your attendance

at the CAT meetings when you can have a say in how the village is policed.

Youth Parish Council: The Parish Council is working to form a Youth Parish Council here in Audlem. Progress has been slow but we had a useful meeting with five young residents who showed some interest, and we are now progressing this initiative with support from Brine Leas School.

Allotments: The Parish Council received a request for allotments but there is no land available and unfortunately we have been unable to proceed.

WEAVER VALLEY PROJECT.

Audlem Parish Council and the Parish Plan were represented at a meeting held on 5 July to hear about plans for the Weaver Valley Regional Park and the Weaver Way. Held at Crewe Alex's ground, the meeting, hosted by the Mersey Basin Campaign, was attended by delegates from across Cheshire.

Mike Cooksley of the Weaver Valley Park explained how Cheshire was concentrating its tourism development on three key projects – making Chester Zoo a world class attraction; the renaissance of Chester as a tourist destination and the Weaver Valley Park.

He explained how tourism currently earns the county £1billion a year. The plan is to double that by 2015. Audlem is, of course, the southern gateway to the Weaver Valley Park and the Weaver Way, the long-distance footpath that will extend from the village to the banks of the Mersey. Another speaker, John Gittins of the Cheshire Landscape Trust, explained to the audience how he had fought to have the Park extended southwards from its original boundary to include Audlem. This followed pressure from Audlem Online and local newspapers eighteen months ago.

Village representatives now plan to meet up with Isabelle Gascoigne of the Mersey Basin Campaign, who is looking after projects in the Upper Weaver Valley, and representatives of the Weaver Valley Project to discuss how a number of tourism and environmental ideas in Audlem can be taken forward.

MOSELEY'S YARD

The development is now well under way. All of the apartments have been sold and the show home, a 3 bed 3 storey house, opened at the beginning of July. It is expected that the first residents will move in around the end of August. The Co-op will move in sometime in October to a slightly bigger store with more staff.

THE LORD COMBERMERE

The plans for conversion of part of the upper floor are on display in the hall of the main entrance. The conversion will have 5 en suite bedrooms and the building work will commence at the end of September and will occupy a large unused space above the dining area. Steve Nash, Licensee, said that the décor of the rooms will mirror that in the bars downstairs. He has a background in hotels and aims to provide good comfortable accommodation at an affordable price. They currently get several enquiries each week as to whether they have accommodation so Steve is hopeful for the success of this venture.

HYDRO-ELECTRIC OPPORTUNITY TESTED

DerwentHydro, a company that specializes in small-scale hydro-electric schemes, visited the village in June to see if there was any opportunity to generate 'green' electricity using the Shropshire Union Canal's water. There is normally a strong flow down the sluice gates to the side of the lock gates and in all, a 93ft, or 30m, drop over the run of 15 locks. The idea has been discussed with British Waterways and a grant was obtained from an Environmental Trust to pay for the feasibility study.

John and Ollie, of DerwentHydro walked the length of the lock system, measuring locks, calculating volumes of water, making initial estimates and creating interest amongst the many narrowboat crews negotiating the locks. One crewmember even turned out to be an expert in tidal turbines. DerwentHydro will now see if a scheme would be feasible that doesn't affect the lock system and whether it would generate enough electricity to make any investment worthwhile. More when we receive their report.

THE DIORAMAS ARE COMING

Two dioramas will shortly appear in the village – one in the Public Hall car park and the other on the canal bank near the Shroppie Fly.

For the uninitiated, dioramas are illustrated maps with "you are here" signs and ours will show shops and places of interest in Audlem and the surrounding area so that visitors to the village can find their way around. The dioramas will be similar to the large map currently residing on the wall of W H Smiths in Nantwich - but of course we think they'll be better!

They have been funded by the Parish Council and the project to produce them was driven by the Community Projects Committee. This committee has been working since before the Parish Plan was published to turn some of the recommendations it contains into reality. Watch out for news on some of the other projects in the next newsletter.

LITTER-BIN TIPPER CAUGHT ON CAMERA

When PC Maple was on duty in Audlem recently he found that one of the litter bins at the edge of the football pitch had been deliberately emptied onto the field. A check of the Public Hall car park CCTV system clearly showed a youth taking the bin off onto the field. PC Maple was able to identify the offender, who was not local, and he has issued him with a £50 fixed penalty notice for litter.

AUDLEM WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

The WI continues to hold their meetings on the first Thursday in each month despite all the media coverage on T.V. Still there's no such thing as bad publicity and at least it has awakened people to the fact that the members are lively folk and the organisation attracts the most prestigious people - even Camilla, Duchess of Cornwall is a member.

Over the last 6 months we have had some super speakers. We have learnt to "live with men", "life behind the headlines" and all about a "policeman's lot". We have been on 2 theatre outings to the Lyceum to see "Kiss me Kate" and "Fiddler on the Roof" and a pleasant afternoon was spent at Cholmondley castle with afternoon tea. In August we will be off to Llandudno and in autumn there will be another theatre evening and a very special Christmastide day out to Walton Hall on the Wirral.

On September 22nd we will be holding our WI autumn show in the Public Hall. There will be exhibits of all types from produce to photography and more, on display to be judged. This is a must for all the village to visit, open 2pm with refreshments and plants for sale.
