Annual Report 2010-11

Kate Down, Chairman, writes:

I have recently completed my second year of office as Chairman of the Parish Council. It has been a particularly busy year for the Council and I would like to record my thanks to fellow councilors, and Jean White and John Kemble, for their support and hard work during the year.

Once again, we had a great Cheshire Community Action awards night. Audlem again won the Best Kept Village award, also the Best Community Website, and was highly commended for its newsletter, and a Little Gem award was given to the cemetery. Congratulations to all those concerned in bringing this about.

Improvements to the facilities of the village are always good to see. This year the Council supported the regeneration of the towpath leading to the new marina and the introduction of the Audlem Lass, the ferry between the village and the Overwater Marina, and I was pleased to be among her first passengers. The Council also set in place the improvements to the footpath between the Shroppie Fly and the playing field.

As mentioned last year, the Age Concern Lunchtime Club was threatened with closure. Since then, I am very pleased to report that local efforts have resulted in a trust, Audlem and District Community Action, being formed to protect and continue the services provided from Thornton House.

We have had a lot of concern this year about the possible transfer and devolution of services to Parish Councils and an explanatory letter was sent to all residents with the spring newsletter. The immediate outcome has been the closure of the public toilets but, after negotiations with Cheshire East, we are now able to refurbish and take them over. Hopefully they will be

reopened in the near future and will be much improved.

We are still concerned about the heavy lorries using the A525 despite it being deprimed and are working towards getting a weight restriction as well as monitoring the traffic using the road at the side of the church.

As the Council was up for election this year, we saw the resignation of four councillors, David Rowe, Geoff Stretch, Andrew Smith and Peter Morgan, and I would like to express the Council's thanks for all their hard work. We are now pleased to welcome David Siddorns, John Langston, Heather Jones and Jill Sanders to the Council.

Audlem Lass

The Audlem Lass has now carried 2,280 passengers since 22 April 2011. We have also collected £1,950, which has more than covered the costs of the British Waterways licence and our public liability insurance. This means that after fuel costs the full amount can go to the lifeboat appeal. The money is sent to the Crewe and Nantwich branch treasurer who ensures the proceeds go to the New Brighton appeal.

We meet on the first Thursday of the month at the Scout and Guide Hall. Our membership has increased this year but as always we extend a warm welcome to visitors and new members.


