Kate Down, Chairman, writes:

I have recently completed my third year as Chairman of the Parish Council. It has again been a very busy year for the council and I would like to thank my fellow councillors, Jean White and John Kemble for all their support and hard work.

There have been some changes to the way the Parish Council operates. The introduction of unitary government (in our case Cheshire East) has brought the Parish Council into more direct contact with the top layer of local government and given us a greater opportunity to influence local events.

Following the direction provided by Audlem's excellent Parish Plan, every councillor now has their own area of responsibility, each shadowing a Parish Plan group.

This year saw Cllr Irene Stockton step down after 15 years of service and Geoff Seddon fill the resulting vacancy. Many thanks to Irene for her contribution.

It also saw the appointment of two new Newsletter editors, Kira Nicholls and Jennifer Cope, after the resignation of Margaret Roberts who had done a fantastic job for six years. Unfortunately, after one edition, Jennifer had to step down due to other work commitments, but Kira is still there and doing a great job of updating the look of the newsletter. A recent competition gave it its new name and masthead, and you will find more about the competition results and newsletter survey in this issue.

Whilst much of the council's work is ongoing, it is great to see a project come to fruition. I was delighted to be involved in the official opening of the refurbished public toilets on 16 November and, as they now belong to Audlem, they are an asset we must treasure and we must make sure that their standard is maintained. Particular thanks go to Cllrs Consterdine and Hill for all their hard work in achieving this.

Another success this year was winning The Community Spirit Award in the Cheshire Community Pride Competition, which is probably a true reflection of Audlem and its residents.

Finally, we are very sorry to be saying goodbye to our Clerk, Jean White, who is retiring after almost 10 years of excellent service. We wish her all the best for the future and expect to announce the name of our newly appointed Clerk soon.



Village Meeting 2012



This year's Annual Village Meeting took place on 18 June when the topic was Superfast Broadband (SFBB). More than 50 residents saw presentations from BT and Connecting Cheshire.

highlighted These the fact that the 800plus telephone numbers on the Audlem exchange were unlikely to be in the next roll-out of SFBB in Cheshire and

only the submission of a bid to be included in the rollout, together with a significant number of registrations of interest, might change this position.

A team was immediately set up by Audlem Parish Council to muster support from residents and businesses for SFBB. The main problem was completing this task by the 6 July deadline. With a leaflet drop and much-appreciated help from Audlem Online, the amazing result was that 300 registrations of interest were received by Connecting Cheshire by the deadline (with more still arriving daily).

In the meantime, the team, with help from a consultant, completed the vast array of paperwork that was required for the bid and sent off in time for the deadline. The Parish Council thanks all those who made the bid possible by registering their interest.

Newsletter survey: views and queries

Thank you to everyone who responded to the Newsletter survey. We were delighted to learn that 99 per cent of those who replied were happy with the newsletter overall. We received some excellent suggestions for items and plan to include some of them in the future – so watch this space.

In answer to some of your queries, Audlem Parish Council sponsors the printing of the newsletter and unfortunately we do not have sufficient funds to print the Business Directory more than once a year. The website also has an up-to-date Buy/Sell section of items currently available free or for sale. The meeting was attended by 26 people and included an excellent talk from Jo Hawkins from the local branch of the Alzheimer's Society.

ADCA has been fortunate in receiving the continued support of the Parish Council, local churches, Audlem Medical Practice, Wulvern Housing, Cheshire East Council and a host of other local people and groups.

We have expanded the Tuesday Day Club membership from 10 to 22 people. We have also recruited 10 new volunteers to help with a variety of tasks alongside our 12 longer standing volunteers and staff team. Speakers, music, reminiscence, chat, days out to a favourite country pub for a meal and our

recent Jubilee Patio Party have all contributed to an active and growing membership. We also have up to 15 people attending our Friday morning Coffee Club.

As a Charitable Trust, we aim to provide physical and mental stimulation, social activity and support to carers, and to promote social inclusion and independence. We plan to recruit more volunteers so we can continue to expand our services. First Responders need YOU!

When an elderly Audlem resident recently lost consciousness without warning, relatives dialled 999. The operator was still giving instructions when Linda Chatham from the Audlem First Responders arrived, complete with a defibrillator, to take charge.

Audlem is fortunate to have a team of First Responders who are willing to dash to the aid of someone in urgent need: in the case of a heart attack, every second counts. Defibrillators can be found at the following village locations (when open): Co-op; Audlem Cyclesport; The Mill Shop; Audlem Medical Practice; Audlem Fire Station.

The First Responders' recent Heart Start course was well attended and further courses are in the pipeline. Attendees are given vital information and training to help save someone's life in an emergency situation before the First Responders or Paramedics arrive. Young people will be especially welcome so please do come along and learn how to save a life.
