FIGHTING BACK AGAINST VANDALISM AND UNSOCIABLE BEHAVIOUR

PARISH PLAN LAUNCHED

Over 30 volunteers have been working on the Audlem Parish Plan. The Plan proposes a range of ideas and projects that the people of Audlem have requested. The draft plan was discussed at a Public Meeting in the Public Hall on 22nd September. Following a village questionnaire in March, seven working groups looked at key issues: Traffic & the Environment; Community including Sport & Leisure; Local Businesses including Tourism; Health & Education; Youth; Planning and Communications. A section on law and order was added later.

These groups agreed a list of Action Plans including short term projects that can be achieved now or in the near future - the new website for example - through to major projects such as new sports facilities that may take 5-10 years. Copies of the plan will be distributed to all households in Audlem Parish.

PUBLIC HALL

2005 has been a very positive centenary year for Audlem Public Hall. Some £80,000 has been invested on the fabric of the building. February saw the completion of the new toilets and storage area, which were inaugurated at the Valentine's Ball. This was such a success it is now to be an annual event so put 18th Feb 06 in your diary. Strictly Come Dancing fans will be pleased to know that the floor has now been renovated at a cost of £2,500.

Future plans include; a new floor and cupboards in the bar, new curtains in the Main Hall, replacement windows and 200 new comfortable upright chairs. You can support us, and raise money at the same time, by buying a ticket for the 20 week draw – available from 18 Feb 06 from any committee member. Each ticket offers the chance of a weekly £10 prize and during the Music Festival in May the final prizes of £250, £150, £100 and £50 will be drawn.

TOURIST INFORMATION CENTRE

Audlem now has its own Tourist Information Centre at Williams' newsagents in the Village Square. It is unique for a village of this size to have a TIC which now provides information, guidebooks, maps and Audlem gifts.

ANNUAL VILLAGE MEETING

It's planned to have a meeting each year to hear presentations and discuss issues of interest, including the Parish Plan. The first Audlem Annual Meeting will be in April. More details to come.

BUERTON SCHOOL CLOSURE

Concerned parents have started a campaign to prevent the closure of Buerton School in July 2006. The closure threat results from a review of education in Cheshire called Transforming Learning Communities. Three South Cheshire schools, including Buerton, have been identified for possible closure.

Parents and local residents are determined to keep the school open. A similar threat 7 years ago was defeated by concerted action by residents and parents. Letters are to be sent and a petition from the community is well under way. There could be an impact on Audlem's St James' school with larger class sizes as the school is near to capacity.

MULLER DEVELOPMENT AT CANALSIDE YARD

Audlem Parish Council organised two meetings, which were both packed by concerned residents, to discuss the proposed development of Canalside Yard. Muller's were invited to give their views at the second meeting but did not attend.

CRICKET CLUB'S SUCCESSFUL SEASON

Audlem CC's 1st XI bounced straight back to Division 2 of the Cheshire Cricket Alliance. Club Captain, Steve Swallow, was delighted at the 1st XI's success and promised to aim for promotion to Division 1 next season. Complementing the success of the 1st XI, the 2nd XI reached the semi final of the League Knockout Cup, before eventually losing to local rivals Aston. The Cricket Club is reviving its Junior Section next season, with weekly coaching sessions for children from 6 to 16years. New members are always welcome. MEET ANDREW SMITH, PARISH COUNCILLOR

Most will know Andrew Smith in his role as Postmaster working behind the counter of Audlem's Post Office, which has been in the same family for 140 years. The shop started out as a general store and became a Post Office in the 1930s. Andrew began working there in the mid 80s when he returned to Audlem from Stoke-on-Trent. It is still very much a family run business with Andrew's mother and wife helping out when needed. Andrew, who was born and

went to school in the village, has seen many changes over the years. For instance the village used to support 3 petrol stations and 5 pubs and like many others, Andrew is passionate about villagers supporting the remaining businesses and believes the shops need to supply the products that people want in order to stay viable.

In addition to running the Post Office, Andrew is also a member of Audlem Parish Council. He was co-opted onto the council 6 years ago following the resignation of one of the members. As Andrew lived and worked in the village he was an ideal candidate and has since become a full member of the council. Audlem PC raises a considerable amount in precepts and an issue in which Andrew takes a keen interest is that of paying double taxation on cemeteries - one to Audlem and one to Crewe & Nantwich - an ongoing battle. Some of the monies raised through precepts support local organisations and Andrew believes many are more effective because of this aid. Another issue close to Andrew's heart is that he would like to see greater cooperation between Audlem, Hankelow and Buerton PCs as he believes we are all part of one community. As if this wasn't enough, Andrew is also a very active member of ASET (Audlem Special Events Team). Andrew tells me that, like many of the good things in life ASET was dreamt up over a convivial pint in the pub when Paddy Kenshole thought it would be good to have a Proms in the Park in Audlem. With one voice the rest of the company agreed that this was a daft idea! Well we all know what became of that one and the money raised from this event helps fund many others. As a result ASET was created 5 years ago purely for the benefit of the residents of Audlem and has raised the profile of Audlem considerably. For such a shortlived organisation ASET's success is extensive and visitors come to Audlem from far and wide to join us at these events.
