CONGRATULATIONS! And "thank you" to all volunteers and sponsors for their efforts over Christmas and New Year. The Christmas trees and decorations by ADAS were admirable and greatly enjoyed by residents and visitors. The firework display at New Year was jointly funded by ASET, ADAS and the Parish Council.

#### PROPOSAL FOR A YOUTH COUNCIL

On behalf of the Parish Council, Chairman Richard Furber and Cllr Geoff Stretch are assessing interest in the formation of a Youth Council for the village with the aim of involving young people now in community responsibility and decision-making, whilst also preparing them for civic participation in the future. A similar initiative in Malpas has been successful and is contributing to a safer and, hopefully, a more sustainable community for all residents. Parents are asked to encourage their children to attend the open meeting in March. Look out for the posters in a few weeks' time.

#### **COMMUNITY PRIDE COMPETITION**

Our success in the 2006 competition was celebrated by Cheshire Landscape Trust on Wednesday 29th November by the planting of a native wild cherry tree in the dog walking area near the playing field. The "planting party" included Mrs Helen Carey (Chairman of Cheshire Landscape Trust and former National Chairman of the Women's Institute), Bob Price (Cheshire Landscape Trust Trustee) and our Chairman, Richard Furber. The Parish Council has already taken the decision to enter the 2007 competition – can we surpass last year's efforts?

#### **ALLOTMENTS**

We are still without a suitable piece of land. Is there *anyone* out there willing to let a level patch of land for 14 years? (Agreements with allotment holders would prevent the growth of a shanty town.)

#### **BUDGETS & PRECEPT FOR 2007/08**

Following a great deal of discussion, the Parish Council has reluctantly agreed that the parish precept must rise from £23,065 to £25,065. As there was no increase in 2005 and 2006, reserves are not sufficient to fund the usual village donations and planned projects as well as the new national agreement relating to the Clerk's terms and conditions of employment.

# **DOG CONTROL ORDER CONSULTATION**

Those attending a recent Parish Council meeting listened to a presentation by Crewe & Nantwich Borough Council's Keith Davies and his colleague on dog control measures which have been put out for consultation within the whole of the borough.

Full details of the proposals are available at Crewe & Nantwich Borough Council. A summary of the main proposals and the full document is also available on the Council's website. Many of the proposals being put forward make good sense, like the need to exclude dogs from marked playing pitches and enclosed children's play areas. However, those at the meeting were concerned about the suggestion that dogs should be kept on the lead at all times on land owned by British Waterways ie the canal towpaths. It was felt that this was an unnecessary and unworkable restriction. Do read the proposals in full and send your views in writing to Jan Griffiths, Business Manager Enforcement, marked Dog Control Orders at Crewe & Nantwich Borough Council, Pyms Lane Depot, Pyms Lane, Crewe, Cheshire CW1 3PJ or by email addressed to jan.Griffiths@crewe-nantwich.gov.uk. Because of the interest provoked by these proposals, the original closing date of 26<sup>th</sup> January has had to be extended, so there should still be time to add your views if you wish.

## **CO-OP AND MOSELEY'S YARD**

With notices now up on the fencing around Moseley's Yard detailing the Co-op's application for an alcohol licence for a Late Shop at Unit 1, Moseley's Yard, there's confirmation of what many have known for months - the Co-op will be crossing the road when the new development is completed.

This means Audlem will be getting a larger shop, and presumably a larger range of goods in the planned new Co-op. # **BEWARE BOGUS CALLERS**

A reminder for people to be wary of callers at their door. On the 13th December a man called at an address in Weaver View, purporting to be a meter reader. He asked for access to the house but was told that the meter was on the outside wall. The householder was suspicious and reported the matter to the police. Checks with the electricity supplier confirmed that no official meter reader was working in the area that day and so we can be certain that this man was not who he claimed to be."

Remember to ask for identification from any such caller and, if possible, note the registration number of any vehicle used. In this case the man was described as in his mid-thirties, 5' 8" and of average build. He was using a small white van (no other details available).
