Public consultation on Local Plan

Cheshire East Council is giving people the opportunity to get involved in the next stage of consultation on its draft Local Plan to shape and protect the future growth of the Borough. The new Local Plan will aim to promote economic growth, improve connectivity and protect our countryside from unplanned development for the next 20 years.

Cheshire East Council Leader Councillor Michael Jones said, 'I take very seriously my responsibility to protect the people of Cheshire East from unwanted and unplanned development. The Development Strategy will deliver 27,000 new houses and 20,000 new jobs, and the infrastructure needed for this to happen. It will also continue to support Cheshire East's position both as the economic powerhouse of the North West and as a beautiful place to live.

'This is a sustainable, plan-led Development Strategy, which sends a strong message to the developers besieging our towns, inviting them to work with us to strengthen our towns and deliver positive outcomes for the people of Cheshire East.'

Although the Local Plan does not specifically cover Audlem, it is the important framework on which planning strategies for villages and rural areas will be built. It includes proposals for both Nantwich and Crewe which could influence future planning strategies for our area, so please take the opportunity to look at these and have your say.

Electricity supply upgrades

Some major upgrades to the local electricity supply are to be carried out in the Kinsey Heath, Chapel End and

Whitchurch Road areas between late January and early March 2013. This will involve some road closures and diversions, traffic lights and electricity being switched off for periods in affected areas. However, residents will receive written notification of how and when they are to be affected at least 10 days before the work is due to start in their particular area.

Scottish Power apologises for any inconvenience this may cause but maintains that the work is essential.

Community power scheme

The Parish Council is looking into the feasibility of a setting up a Community Power scheme.

This has already been successfully done by South Lakeland Council which, working alongside a specialist organisation, arranged for a group of over 500 residents to switch their energy supplier and make savings of between £200 and £750 each on their energy bills.

The scheme will require individual residents to register their interest in joining such a scheme. Further details will be made available should the scheme prove to be practicable.

Rural Housing Needs Survey

The Parish Council and Audlem & District Community Action [ADCA] have been working with Cheshire East Council and Wulvern Housing to collect up-to-date evidence of local housing needs for both affordable housing and supported housing within Audlem.

In addition, Wulvern Housing plans to replace the supported housing facility, Thornton House on Cheshire Street, with a modern, fit-for-purpose complex at some point within the next two to three years. ADCA currently uses Thornton House's communal lounge and kitchen to run its Day and Coffee Clubs, and has plans to expand its services there.

It is therefore important to gather the views of local people, find out about the need generally for affordable housing in the village, and establish the exact type and size of any future proposed building on the Thornton House site to ensure that these vital community facilities continue.

It is five years since the last Rural Housing Survey was undertaken locally so the Parish Council, with the help of ADCA and Cheshire East Council, has decided to undertake a new survey. Confidential questionnaires will be distributed to each household in Audlem at the end of January 2013 and will be collected by Parish Councillors and ADCA volunteers in early February 2013.

Cheshire East Council will collate the results and the Parish Council will ensure they are made available within the village. This is an important opportunity for your voice to be heard so please do take the time to study the questionnaire and give your views.

Calling 101 to report incidents

Please remember to call the police on 101 to report an incident or suspicious activity that does not warrant a 999 emergency call. By doing this the incident will be officially recorded which, in turn, will help to ensure that police resources are deployed appropriately in the Audlem area.

For example, you should call 101 if:

- · Your car has been stolen.
- · Your property has been damaged.
- You suspect drug use or dealing in your neighbourhood.

Or to:

Report a minor traffic collision.

- Give the police information about crime in your area.
- Speak to the police about a general enquiry.

 101 has been introduced as part of the Government's wider work to improve access to the police, ease pressure on 999, and help to tackle crime and disorder efficiently and effectively.

Citizen's Advice Bureau

Are you affected by the welfare reforms to benefits? The CAB has a rural service that visits Buerton School playing fields on Fridays from 9.30am to 10.00am. It then moves on to Audlem public car park from 10.15am to 12.15pm. Finally, it visits Thornton House from 12.30pm to 1.00pm.

We offer a free, confidential and impartial advice service and can offer help with how these reforms may affect you and your family, and with many other problems too.

Parish Council meetings will be held at Thornton House on Mondays: 4 February, 4 March and 15 April. At the beginning of each meeting, residents have the opportunity to bring matters of particular concern to the attention of the Parish Council. Everyone is welcome to stay and listen for the rest of the meeting.

Tales of The White Lion

Bon viveurs will be pleased to note that The White Lion public house in Hankelow has reopened following a spell as an Indian restaurant. The landlord is currently seeking an experienced chef and plans to start serving fine food towards the end of February.



A public house has stood on the site for more than 300 years. Audlem resident, Ray Smith, recalls some characters who frequented the bar in the mid-1900s:

'George Dutton had a wooden leg and in The White Lion they liked to trick strangers by getting him to sing 'The Green Eye of the Little Yellow God of Kathmandu'. When the line came up about the knife he would stab himself in his wooden leg much to the visitors' horror.

'The present Hankelow Chapel was built on land donated by Chris Williamson and everyone contributed. The bricklayers were father and son known as "Major" Shenton and "Jack the lad". As they spent the lunchtime from 11.00am to 2.00pm in The White Lion the chapel became known as the "Drunken Chapel".

'Joby Buckley was the postman up there and he had a dog he would take into The White Lion. If he clicked his fingers at the dog, then anyone that moved, he'd have their leg off. Joby did this one day and when Reg Banks entered, the dog snarled at him. Reg went back round to the house (he lived with Ma Cartwright) and came back with his shotgun. He cocked it and wafted it round the room, everyone ducked their heads and Reg said, "Right now, click him, Joby, if you dare". It was like the Wild West.'
