Annual Village Meeting 2013

This year, the Annual Village Meeting, which took place on 26 March in the Public Hall, enjoyed a change of format.

The organisations attending, Connecting Cheshire, Cheshire East Council, Cheshire Constabulary, Wulvern Housing and ADAPT (Audlem & District Acting Positively For Transition), all set up stalls with wonderful displays. Representatives of each organisation gave a short explanation about why they were there to a seated audience of village members who were then able to ask questions informally at each of the stalls.

Members of ADAPT promoted their message of finding ways to live more simply and sustainably, and invited others to join in events. Connecting Cheshire gave information on Superfast Broadband and encouraged anyone not already registered as an interested party to do so. Cheshire East Council promoted the possible Community Power scheme, Wulvern Housing gave an update on the development of the Thornton House site, and our local Police Community Support Officers were there to answer any questions and discuss local policing affairs.

The meeting was quite well attended, despite the extremely cold weather and a clash with a rather important football match! The new format of the meeting appeared to be successful, as it enabled everyone present to discuss matters in an informal setting and to take something away with them. Thank you to everyone who supported the meeting and to the representatives present, who felt that it had been a worthwhile event.

Gladman housing proposal

Over 100 residents attended an Extraordinary Parish Council meeting on 11 April to discuss the proposal by

Gladman Developments to build up to 120 houses at Little Heath, on land off Audlem Road.

The meeting heard that Cheshire East's lack of a Local Plan for housing needs in villages had led to Audlem being vulnerable to speculative developers.

The Parish Council is determined to work with local residents to assess Audlem's housing needs and available land for building, within the framework of the Village Design Statement which was updated in December 2011.

What a mess!

Despite pleas to dog owners to ensure that they behave responsibly and clean up after their dogs, some people are just not getting the message.

To try to reduce the mess on the playing field, the Parish Council requests that dog owners do not walk their dogs there. If you have to cross the field, dogs should be kept on a lead and not allowed to run free. If a dog does foul the playing field, owners are requested to clear up and dispose of the excrement in the bins.

Unfortunately, it is not only the playing field. The village pavements and the canal bank are also being blighted by dog faeces. It will take a concerted effort by all residents – not just the Parish Council – to shame irresponsible dog owners into ‘scooping the poop’ to get this problem under control.

Residents are urged to speak to dog owners who fail to clean up after their pets. If you don't feel confident in doing so, and you know who the owner is, please contact the **Dog Wardens on dogwardens@cheshireeast.gov.uk or 0300 123 5021** giving information on the owner. You will be asked for your name and contact details but this will not be revealed to the dog owner.

Dog wardens can issue £50 fixed penalty notices and dog owners who fail to pay risk a £1,000 fine for non-compliance.

Heartstart Audlem

There are seven AEDs (Automated External Defibrillator) located in the Audlem area. Do you know where they are? Do you know how to use one? Could you give emergency life-saving help to someone who needs it?

Due to the ‘Heartstart Audlem’ scheme supported by the British Heart Foundation and the Audlem Community First Responder Team, there are 80 local residents who do. This is still a small number out of the overall population. If you would like to join a course and become a potential lifesaver, please email heartstartaudlem@btinternet.com. We encourage families to attend. We can train children as young as 10 years old if accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Parish Council meetings will be held at Thornton House on Mondays: 13 May, 10 June and 15 July. At the beginning of each meeting, residents have the opportunity to bring matters of particular concern to the attention of the Parish Council. Everyone is welcome to stay and listen for the rest of the meeting.

Anniversary weekend

Audlem Methodist Church has been on its current site for 150 years. A number of occasions are being planned this year to commemorate this anniversary.

The next is an ‘Anniversary Weekend’ from Thursday 4 July to Sunday 7 July that will include:

a sing-along video reprise of this year's musical, *The Story So Far*, on Thursday; a Church Family Birthday Meal followed by entertainment on Friday; an exhibition at AMC of photos and artifacts from 150 years of local Methodist history on Saturday; and a special anniversary service on Sunday. Details of all these occasions will be available soon.

Raise the roof



Two years ago lead was stolen from the roof of St James's Church on the north side – the section over the organ. Since lead theft is so frequent, we made an application to repair the roof properly with a non-lead replacement that would be of no value to thieves and, in the meantime, carried out a temporary repair. Permission has taken some time because St James is a Grade 1 listed building, however, it has now been granted. The cost is over £25,000.

We have received £5,480 from the insurance company and we should get £4,500 for the lead that was not stolen. Our total donations to date are £7,275 and a huge thank you goes to all those people in the village who have been very generous. I did a sponsored walk which has so far raised £2,280 including Gift Aid, and we're working hard to raise the rest.

Over the next few months there will be a variety of fund-raising events including a bridge drive, a bingo evening at the Public Hall, a coffee morning, an afternoon tea, a quiz night and there is even a project to write a book to sell.

We hope the roof repair will be done this summer, as the temporary repairs will only hold for so long. Should you win the lottery, or just be feeling generous, please remember your village church at the heart of our community. It is always open for prayer, peace and quiet, as well as Praise and Play (definitely not quiet) and the other services – Sunday worship, baptisms, weddings and funerals.
