Business summary, April 2015

Parish Council election

As reported on Cheshire East's website, Audlem is among the majority of parish councils where no election will be taking place.*

This is because only 12 applications were received for the 12 vacancies. The applicants are: Frances Mary Christie, Bill Consterdine, Kate Down, David Higham, Mike Hill, Phil Johnson, Heather Jones, Peter Oxley, Geoff Seddon, Pam Seddon, David Siddorns and Ann Tilling. They are expected to be formally elected at the Parish Council meeting on Monday, 11 May 2015.

*Only 14 parish councils out of a total of 97 throughout the whole of Cheshire East will be holding elections.

Playing field complex

Councillors were pleased to learn from Councillor Rachel Bailey that the Cheshire East Council Finance meeting on 13 April '...Resolved that approval be given for the following assets to be prioritised for approval to transfer and that reports on their transfer be prepared and considered by the Portfolio holder as a priority.' The first item listed is 'Audlem – the car park, playing field and playground and land at the rear of the Public Hall'.

It is thought the land at the rear of the Public Hall will be the subject of a separate report later in the month. Audlem Parish Council has written to Cheshire East Council to request that outstanding repairs and queries that need to be resolved prior to any transfer are dealt with as soon as possible. Further information will be provided in the next few weeks.

Parish Council Meetings will be held in the Meeting Rooms adjoining Audlem Methodist Church on Mondays 11 May, 8 June and 13 July. At the beginning of each meeting, residents have the opportunity to bring matters of concern to the attention of the Parish Council. Everyone is welcome to stay and listen for the rest of the meeting.

Neighbourhood Plan status

A key milestone for a Neighbourhood Plan is when it enters the Presubmission Consultation stage. It must be sent to any recognised bodies whose interests may be affected by the Plan, such as statutory bodies including Highways, Utilities and the NHS, as well as voluntary organisations and other Parish Councils in the immediate area. They have six weeks within which to comment on the Plan.

Audlem's Neighbourhood Plan entered this phase at the end of April 2015. SO WHAT? Good question.

Immediately a Draft Plan is submitted it becomes officially recognised **Emerging** an Plan. As such, it will be taken into consideration for any new development applications that are made to Cheshire East Council. There are examples where Emerging Plans have successfully been used to prevent inappropriate developments. There are no guarantees, of course, but if we don't make an attempt, then we will definitely have no influence over the future of Audlem.

Audlem District Amenities Society is entering a comparatively quiet period; our only event in the near future is the Fashion Show on 2 July 2015. However, the committee members will shortly be very busy delivering our annual envelope appeal to all the households in our area. We hope that everyone appreciates the Christmas trees and lights, year-round flower displays and so on, and will donate accordingly.

Audlem in Bloom

As an ADAS sub-committee, A.I.B. will soon be in its busiest period. Hanging baskets will be put in place in the week before the Music Festival with summer bedding to be planted in early June. The pink and white winter/spring colour scheme will continue and we anticipate that this will provide an eye-catching display throughout the summer.

History Society events

A large audience gathered in February when we were extremely privileged to hear Peter Styles, Geophysics Professor at Keele University and an advisor to government committees, give a talk on 'The Geology of Cheshire'. Such was his enthusiasm that even those of us with little or no knowledge of geology were

kept enthralled and left the m e e t i n g determined to take more interest in our surroundings. Touching on the subject

of fracking, Professor Styles said that shale deposits under Audlem were too deep and too hot to develop.

On 21 May Reverend Canon Darrel Speedy will give a talk on 'Historic Events at Barthomley' in The Scout & Guide Hall at 7.30pm. This will be followed on 12 June with a driveyourself outing to Barthomley Church and Englesea Brook Museum.

On 4 July we are holding a Coffee Morning from 10.30am to 12.30pm in The Scout & Guide Hall when everyone, young and old, is invited to share their memories of 'Growing Up In and Around Audlem'. A large number

of photos and memorabilia will be on display, a small selection of which will be exhibited beforehand on Carnival Day to
