# Audlem Parish Council Parish Council News, July 2019 Chairman's Report 2018/2019

Wow, what a year! Possibly the biggest occurrence in the history of the Parish Council has happened – the purchase of Turnpike Field. Imagine my shock when receiving the phone call that confirmed that our bid had been successful. This rapidly turned to delight as I realised that the field was now safe from housing development and would be used for the benefit of residents in the years to come. I must thank all residents for their support and pay tribute to the energy of all Councillors, especially Heather Jones in making the purchase happen. The Turnpike Field Working Group of four Councillors and five residents has met on a regular basis and sought suggested uses from villagers. I thank all of the Working Group for their commitment, enthusiasm and effort. Residents, especially dog walkers, have already made use of the field via the temporary access gate. The main idea, subject to planning permission, is to provide a 'green' car park, using a mesh through which the grass will grow. Other uses will be firmed up during 2019/20. In addition to paying increased Council Tax, more than 120 residents agreed to make a further donation towards the cost of developing the field for community use. By the end of April the amount raised was over £16,000, with a further £150+ being donated in the 'blue box' in Williams' Newsagents. This response has been amazing and sincere thanks go to all who have donated. If you wish to make a donation, please contact Bee, our Clerk.

Unfortunately, the take-over of the playing field complex is still on hold due to staff issues at both Cheshire East and Fields in Trust.

During the year Heather Jones stepped down from the Council as she and her husband, Howard, relocated to South Wales. Heather's expertise, combined with her drive and enthusiasm has been sorely missed. Owing to work commitments, both Jenny Carlin and Suzie Warren also left and I thank them both for their efforts. However, we have gained Steve Boyes, Nigel Mottershead, Lorna Matthews and Paul Barrett, who were co-opted as Councillors during the year. Their contributions have already proved beneficial to the Council.

As part of Cheshire East's Local Plan 2010 – 2030, all towns and parishes in the Borough have had to provide additional housing sites on top of those that have already been approved. Following discussions with Borough

Council's planners about potential sites for development in the Parish up to 2030, Bird's Nest (opposite McCarthy & Stone) and East View (between Bird's Nest and Monks Lane) were determined to be the most suitable sites. They are earmarked to provide 42 properties between them during the remaining 11 years of the Plan.

The Parish Council has financially supported the Music and Arts Festival, ADCA, the Scout and Guide Hall, the Bowling Club and ADAS during the year. The well-attended Village Meeting in May 2018 promoted the local clubs and societies from which residents benefit.

With Parish Council elections taking place in May, three long-serving Councillors took the opportunity to retire: Frances Mary Christie after more than 20 years; Kate Down after 16 years and David Siddorns after 8 years. I thank them for all the work that they have done during these 50+ years. Their valuable expertise and tireless work will be sadly missed.

I have enjoyed my year as Chairman, but unfortunately, due to my wife's ill health, I am unable to commit the necessary amount of time required to the role and I am handing over to Steve Boyes who, I am sure, will continue to take the Council forward. I would like to take this opportunity to thank my fellow Councillors for their support, in particular my Vice-Chairman, David Higham, for his help during the year. David continues as Vice-Chairman. I also wish to thank our Clerk, Bee, for her support and guidance during her first year in the job. She's certainly had a steep learning curve!

#### **Best Tearoom in Cheshire**

It's official, Farm Made Tearooms is the best tearoom in Cheshire, winning the gold award first prize in the Taste Cheshire Awards 2019.

In a glittering affair with over 400 people in the Pavilion at Chester Racecourse, Taste Cheshire crowned the food and drink champions for 2019. The annual Taste Cheshire Food and Drink Awards, now in their 19th year was packed with both the hospitality trade and food and drink producers from right across Cheshire. 44,000 people voted in the awards to come up with key nominations in each category who were then mystery dined or shopped.

Audlem's very own Farm Made Tearooms got full marks when mystery dined, winning the award on the evening, being the youngest business to ever do so.

#### Urgent repairs needed to St James Church

You may have noticed the stone masons working at St James Church, we are grateful for the money given by the community which has enabled us to start the necessary repairs. However, we urgently need further funds to enable new work which has come to light to be carried out without delay. We had already raised £30,000, of which £20,000 is to be paid for the current work. With a further bill now of around £27,000 + VAT, we need to ask for your help again. We estimate this to be at least £17,000 more than we currently have available in funds.

How can you help?

- Provide immediate monetary donations by cheque or cash. These can be deposited in the donation box at the back of the church or through the letter box at the vicarage. If you are able to gift aid, please put your donation in one of the yellow gift aid envelopes available in church and fill out the details on the front. Cheques should be made payable to 'Audlem PCC'.
- We will be holding a number of fundraising events over the next few months, please support them if you can.
- Buy a copy of the book 'Audlem Remembers' from the canal shop at £12.95, half of the copies printed have been sold but we can raise a further £1,200 if they are all sold.
- Please contact Rev Helen Chantry on 811543 or Peter Ellis, Church Warden on 812227 if you have any other ideas to raise money or any questions you need answering.

If we fail to do this essential work, we could be faced with possible closure of the church, and at the very least barricading/ safety fencing erected around the tower. St James Church is a much admired and iconic public building at the heart of the village. It is open 365 days a year for visitors and residents, as well as providing the venue for many baptisms, weddings, funerals, services and social events, so we hope you will appreciate the need for such an urgent appeal to preserve this historic building.

## Audlem Lass Goes from Strength to Strength

The 2019 Season for the Audlem Lass began on 30th March ready for Mothers' Day and the early school holidays in the run-up to Easter. The weather was kind and this was a great start to our fund raising year.

Our service goes from strength to strength, providing a link to Audlem village from Overwater Marina. Mid-week charters continue to prove very popular, but these need to be pre-booked and are available on non-bank holiday weekdays only.

As a trial this year we are running an additional service linking Overwater Marina and Audlem village each Friday during the school holidays for the month of August (2nd, 9th, 16th, 23rd, 30th). If this is successful we hope to adopt it as a standard service during that month in future years.



The highly successful Overwater Marina RNLI Festival takes place on the 7th and 8th September and, again the Audlem Lass will be running its usual weekend service. None of this could happen of course without the invaluable support of our team of volunteers who give their time so willingly. New volunteers are always welcome.

After a most enjoyable lunch there a short walk took us to the Pankhurst Museum which is now surrounded by Manchester Royal Infirmary. This was home to Emmeline and her daughters from 1898 whilst they were campaigning for women's suffrage.
