Turnpike Fields Wildlife Report for 2023

Review

This report is based on our fourth survey season. We now have very good data regarding the plant life within the fields although we are still adding one or two new species. We also have a good list of birds that frequent the fields and its surrounds. The insects could still do with further research and the animal section requires more reporting of sightings. We have not carried out a fungi survey this year. Generally we have seen a decrease in reported species throughout the whole range. This has been due to less surveying taking place. Also a factor has again been the weather and the changing climate which is having the effect of reducing the flowering season with a knock-on effect for insects.

Plants

80% of our previously recorded plant species have been recorded this year. Those not recorded are primarily single recorded plants which have probably been missed. However we have recorded several new species in particular a Common Spotted Orchid. This was in the top fields and as an indicator of the changing soil nature from "improved" to natural meadow. The other species of orchid, Southern Marsh Orchid again flowered this year. Whilst these are single plants we hope that these and other species will begin to spread.

Insects

The decease in the number of insects recorded is due to the few specific insect surveys carried out and also the short flowering season. However after a slow start the Butterfly population picked up later than previously recorded both in number of species and also, in some cases, in number of particular species.

Birds

We have now recorded a core number of species resident or visiting the Fields. As yet we have seen no positive activity at the nest boxes which were installed a couple of years ago.

Animals

Fewer animals were recoded this year. Two factors may account for this, the first being the need for longer time needed in surveying and the other the increased use of the Fields particularly for dog walking. This does not mean that the species are not present but that the times when they are seen are more limited.

Ponds

The ponds continue to mature. Some maintenance work was done in the Spring. However this seems to have created increase growth in the reed mace. The pond life continues to thrive and one new species of Dragonfly has been recorded this year. The result of the genetic water testing in the Spring for Great Crested Newtons, unfortunately proved negative in both ponds. Further testing will take place next year.

Trees

Most of the newly planted trees continue to grow despite the effects of adverse weather and some vandalism. Newly added this year were a some number of fir trees which ADAS plsanted with a view to future use in the village.

Looking forward

Whilst no programmed usage of the fields has come about, it is clear that village members have defined they own use through recreation and dog walking. The Fields remain a setting in which it is possible for folk to experience, enjoy and appreciate the value of a natural or wild (or semi-wild) space in our community. The different habitats which have been identified need protecting even if to the casual eye they appear untidy and valueless. The ongoing process of regular wildlife survey will help to highlight the living and interacting nature of these habitats. The information outlets already established might be developed further to encourage the natural life and the human community to co-exist happily together.
