

Happy New Year

May we wish all residents a happy and prosperous 2019.

Turnpike Field, Green Lane

The Parish Council has created a temporary gateway into the field from Shropshire Street to give access. The field has become a popular area for dog walkers, especially with its public footpath links to both the canal and Green Lane. The Working Group of Councillors and residents has met on a number of occasions and will be holding an Open Evening on



Thursday 28th February in the Town Hall starting at 7.30pm. Please come along and find out what progress has been made since the last meeting.

The proposal to create a green car park and а permanent access point on Shropshire Street is being pursued and an application to Cheshire East Council for a grant towards the cost has been submitted.

It is pleasing to see many dog walkers using the field. Please can we ask that you keep your dogs under

control and pick up any dog mess. A dog mess bin is to be provided near the entrance on Shropshire Street.

In April and May many residents indicated that they were

willing to make a financial donation towards work to be carried out on the field. The Parish Council will soon be contacting those residents who made this generous offer. If anyone else wishes to donate, please contact the Clerk.

New Councillors

Since the last Around Audlem newsletter three new Councillors have been co-opted. They are Lorna Matthews, Derrian Ellis and Paul Barrett.

Derek Mckelvey

Derek was a past Chairman and Vice Chairman and worked tirelessly as a Parish Councillor for 24 years. His death is a sad loss to the village and surrounding area. We are grateful for the hard work and effort he put in to improve Audlem and are pleased that Derek was able to see the naming of Mckelvey Way on the Anwyl development, a name suggested by the Parish Council.

Parish Council Precept

The Parish Council has set its precept for 2019/20 at £50,000. This is £10,460 more than the current level, purely to cover the repayment of the loan taken out from the Public Works Loan Board. The approximate increase in the Parish Council element of the council tax will be 25%, which is as predicted when views were sought from residents on the purchase of Turnpike Field. For a Band D property the extra amount will be in the region of £10 to £12 per annum. This depends on the increase in the number of occupied properties in the last year. The more that are occupied, the lower the increase will be.

Road Safety Issues

A request has been submitted to Cheshire East to provide a pedestrian crossing near the entrance to the car park on Cheshire Street. This is part of a wide-ranging review of highways issues which has been requested by the Parish Council following the purchase of Turnpike Field.

Parish Council Election

The date for this is Thursday 2nd May. An election will only take place if more than twelve candidates put their names forward, which hasn't happened for many years. Although the Parish Council has a full complement of Councillors, new faces are always welcome.

AWEG (Audlem Wildlife & Ecology Group) is a small group of friends with interests in all areas of wildlife and the environment. We now have a full programme arranged for 2019 including six meetings in the Public Hall Annexe, three field trips, and a short break to investigate the wildlife of Anglesey (now fully booked). Our next meeting is on the 29th January at the Annexe at 7pm when Paul Bell from Shropshire Wildlife Trust will talk on frogs and toads of the UK – all welcome. A £3 charge per person is made at each meeting to cover costs and donations to speakers' causes.


